

Anti-Tip Strap Installation




We strongly recommend using the anti-tip hardware provided to avoid tipping. It is preferred that you locate a wall stud in your drywall. If you locate the stud, anchors are not needed. If there is no stud available, utilize the plastic wall anchors provided.

Place unit against the wall. Fix the plastic bracket in the wall about 2" below the top of the unit (level with the tab). Mark the wall where the bracket will be screwed in. Drill two holes in the wall. If using the wall anchors, tap them into the drilled holes. Secure the bracket using 2 screws each 1-3/16" long



Thread the plastic cable tie through the hole in the tab and through the bracket as shown in the illustration. Feed through the other end of the cable tie and pull until snug. **Do not overtighten**.





Care & Finishing

Thank you for the purchase of your new Legaré product. We certainly hope that it serves you well for many years to come.

Depending upon the finish of your particular components, there are few things that you should do to protect its finish or to in that the finish that you put on it does not cause you any problems.

Pre-Finished Parts

Parts finished with a lacquer finish require litte more than a light coat of lemon oil or furniture polish to make assembly eas preserve the finish. Doing this before assembling the parts will prevent chafing and will make the parts easier to slide togeth

Before putting any heavy objects with pastic or rubber feet on the horizontal surfaces, you should be aware that some materials can discolor the finishes on furniture. Plastics will release plasticizers which can penetrate and stain some finishes. If you equipment has black plastic or rubber feet, put something between the equipment and the surface to protect the finish. Applying a coat of furniture polish or wax can help in many cases, but will not always eliminate the problem. A pad or mat between the surface and the item is the best solution.

Un-Finished Parts

When finishing Legaré furniture yourself, the most important thing to consider is the build-up of any finish that you put on th parts. The Legaré panels are designed with some clearance between the tabs and slots in order to accommodate the build-up of a lacquer finish. If you intend to simply stain your parts, you should not have any problems. However, if you intend to add a sea a thick coat of urethane or lacquer, you need to consider the thickness that these finishes can add to the parts. You may need sand the tabs and slots further if your build-up will exceed 5 or 6 mil (.005"-.006") per side to insure that the panels will s together properly.

When doing any sanding, remember that not all edges are critical. You can save yourself a good amount of labor by not spending excessive time sanding and preparing edges that you will not see or touch. Also, if you intend to put on a sealer, it is not ne to sand the surfaces to a mirror finish as the sealer will tend to fill in the surface roughness of the material. If you should touch up any any gouges or scratches, you can use a small amount of wood dough the color of your final finish. Should any splinters occur along an edge, simply use normal wood glue to re-bond a splinter. And should you need to touch up any edges, use a small trim router with a 3/16" radius round-over bit.

And remember, because Legare is a natural wood product, the resulting finish may vary from piece to piece whether the parts come pre-finished or you finish them yourself.

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
